**ROAD TRANSPORT (GENERAL) ACT 2005**

## MINISTERIAL DECLARATION (LOADED SILAGE TRAILER) ORDER 2013

under the

Road Transport (General) Act 2005

I, DUNCAN GAY, M.L.C., Minister for Roads and Ports, pursuant to section 16 of the Road Transport (General) Act 2005, make the following Order.

**Explanatory Note:**

The object of this Order is to exempt from clause 28 of Schedule 2 to the Road Transport (Mass, Loading and Access) Regulation 2005 (the Regulation) agricultural implements which are used for the carriage of silage. Clause 28 of Schedule 2, which would otherwise apply, prohibits an agricultural implement from carrying a load.

The dimension limits, including the relevant width limits, in clause 24 of Schedule 2 to the Regulation apply to the loaded silage trailers which are the subject of this Order.

## PART 1 – PRELIMINARY

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Ministerial Declaration (Loaded Silage Trailer) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order takes effect on 24 June 2013.

**3. Effect**

This Order remains in force until 24 June 2018, unless earlier revoked.

**4. Interpretation**

Words and expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the Regulation, unless otherwise stated.

**5. Definitions**

In this Order:

‘GCM’, ‘GVM’ have the meanings given in the Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Act 1997;

‘agricultural implement’, ‘dog trailer’, ‘drawbar length’, ‘GTM’, ‘rear overhang’, ‘rear overhang line’, have the meanings given in the Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulation 2007;

‘ground contact width’, ‘load sharing suspension system’, ‘pig trailer’ have the meanings given in the Road Transport (Mass, Loading and Access) Regulation 2005;

‘silage’ means green fodder stored for the purpose of fermentation and intended for the feeding of livestock;

‘silage trailer’ means an agricultural trailer which is an agricultural implement used exclusively for the transport of:

- (a) loose cut green grass and loose cut green crops for the production of silage; and
- (b) loose silage, for the immediate feeding of livestock.

The load cannot include hay or straw.

**6. Exemption from requirements of clause 28 of Schedule 2 to the Regulation**

Clause 28 of Schedule 2 to the Regulation is declared not to apply to a vehicle which is an agricultural implement that is designed to be used and is being used for the carriage of silage.

## PART 2 – DIMENSION AND MASS LIMITS

**7. Dimension Limits**

A silage trailer must comply with the dimension limits as follows. The maximum:

- width for a silage trailer is 3.0 metres. It may only be towed by an agricultural tractor and only as a single tractor trailer combination;
- rear overhang:
  - for a dog-trailer, is the lesser of 60% of the distance between the centre of the front axle and the rear overhang line; and 4.3 metres;
  - for a pig trailer, is the lesser of the length of the load carrying area, or body, ahead of the rear overhang line; and 4.3 metres.

- trailer drawbar length for pig trailer (the distance between the coupling pivot point on a drawbar and the centre line of the axle group or single axle on a trailer with only 1 axle group or single axle) is not over 8.5 metres;
- trailer drawbar length for a dog trailer (the distance between the coupling pivot point on the drawbar of the trailer and the centre line of the front axle group or of the front single axle of the trailer) is not over 5 metres.

The length of the agricultural tractor and silage trailer combination shall not exceed 19 metres.

The height for an agricultural tractor and silage trailer combination shall not exceed 4.3 metres.

#### 8. Mass Limits for an Agricultural Tractor

The mass limit for an axle of an agricultural tractor towing a laden or unladen silage trailer must not exceed the lesser of the:

- tractor manufacturer's permissible Gross Vehicle Mass (GVM) or the Gross Combination Mass (GCM); or
- manufacturer's rating for any of the tractor's components such as tow coupling, towbar, tyres, wheels, suspensions and axles; or
- mass limits set out in Table 1:

#### 9. Mass Limits for a Silage Trailer

The mass of a silage trailer, including any load, must not exceed the lesser of the:

- trailer manufacturer's rated Aggregate Trailer Mass (ATM); or
- mass that would cause the tractor and trailer combination to exceed the tractor's Gross Combination Mass (GCM); or
- mass that would cause the manufacturer's ratings for any of the trailer's components, such as tow coupling, tyres, drawbar, wheels, suspensions and axles to be exceeded; or
- mass limits set out in Table 2:

The total mass of a combination and any load must not exceed 39.0 tonnes.

The loaded mass of a dog trailer or pig trailer must not exceed the loaded mass of the towing vehicle.

### PART 3 – OPERATING CONDITIONS

#### 10. Braking

On a dry, smooth, level road surface with no loose material and with one sustained application of the brake, a vehicle combination, whether laden or unladen, must meet the requirements in Table 3:

The parking brake of a vehicle or combination must be able to hold the vehicle or combination stationary on a 12% gradient.

A silage trailer with a GTM exceeding 750kg must have brakes that operate on at least 1 wheel at each end of 1 or more axles of the trailer.

The braking system of a trailer with a GTM over 2.0 tonnes must allow the driver of a tractor towing the trailer to operate the brakes from a normal driving position.

The braking system of a trailer with a GTM exceeding 2.0 tonnes must incorporate a breakaway system that:

- operates automatically and quickly if the trailer breaks away from the towing vehicle; and
- remains in operation for at least 15 minutes after a break-away; and
- holds the trailer on a 12% gradient while in operation after a break-away.

#### 11. Speed and Distance of Travel

The laden agricultural combination must not travel at a speed greater than the lesser of:

- 20 km/h less than the posted speed limit applying to the section of road on which the combination is travelling; or
- 50 km/h; or
- the maximum operational speed limit specified by the manufacturer for each of the individual vehicles in the combination.

A laden silage trailer being towed by a registered or conditionally registered agricultural tractor may travel a maximum road distance of 15 kilometres with the starting point for travel being where the silage trailer was parked overnight. (An agricultural tractor with an Unregistered Vehicle Permit may not tow a laden silage trailer).

Where travel in excess of 15 kilometres is necessary, an over dimension permit must be obtained prior to the commencement of travel. The permit will allow a maximum distance of travel of 25 kilometres. (While this Ministerial Declaration Order provides for laden travel up to 25 kilometres, travel in excess of 15 kilometres and up to 25 kilometres while laden requires a permit).

An unladen silage trailer is subject to the Class 1 Agricultural Vehicles Notice. The Notice allows unlimited travel for an unladen silage trailer.

The laden and unladen agricultural combination is subject to travel on the approved routes and areas detailed in Appendix 2 of the Class 1 Agricultural Vehicles Notice. As detailed in Appendix 2, where a tractor or trailer exceeds one or more of the stated dimension limits, a specific permit must be obtained before travelling on or in any of the listed Limited Access Locations.

#### 12. Travel Restrictions

Before a vehicle or combination is driven along any route, its driver and owner must be satisfied that the route has been assessed and that the vehicle or combination can be driven along it without causing:

- disruption to telecommunication, electricity, rail, gas, water or sewage services, or
- damage to a road (including a bridge), structure, rail crossing or tree.

A vehicle or combination must not begin to travel if, due to circumstances such as fog, heavy rain, smoke, dust or insect plague: visibility is less than 250 m in the daytime, or the headlights of a vehicle approaching within 250 metres could not be seen at night.

If a vehicle or combination is already travelling when visibility is reduced to the level described, the driver must drive it into the nearest safe parking area, and wait until visibility improves beyond that level before continuing to travel.

### 13. Night Travel

Travel is not permitted between sunset and sunrise for agricultural vehicles or combinations wider than 2.5 metres or longer than 22 metres.

Where the agricultural vehicle or combination is wider than 2.5m or longer than 22 metres, where travel commenced after sunrise and before sunset on a day, the operator is permitted to continue to travel for a distance not exceeding 10 kilometres for the sole purpose of stopping at a safe parking area.

### 14. Warning Devices

Silage trailers that exceed a width of 2.5 metres must:

- display an OVERSIZE sign on the rear of the silage trailer that must:
  - show the word “OVERSIZE”, in black upper-case lettering that conforms with typeface Series C(N) in Australian Standard (AS) 1744 Forms of letters and numerals for road signs, of the minimum dimensions as shown in the diagram;



- Illustration of a warning sign for an oversize vehicle or combination
  - be made from flat, weatherproof, yellow retro-reflective material that conforms with class 1 or 2 of AS 1906 Retro-reflective materials and devices for road control purposes; and
  - have the manufacturer’s name or trademark, and the brand and class of retro-reflective material permanently marked in block letters not more than 10 millimetres high appearing in any visible location on the sign; and
  - have a black border at least 20 millimetres wide, the outermost edge of the border must be set at least 10 millimetres in from the edge of the sign unless the warning sign has been made with a box edge;
  - be mounted vertically such that the lower edge of the sign must be above the bottom of the bumper bar; or if there is no bumper bar, at least 500 millimetres from the ground level;
  - if the sign is split into two parts, each part must be fitted at the same height as the other, but with no border between the two parts;
  - and be kept clean.
- have a warning light fixed to its highest practicable point when it is on a major road. The warning light when switched on, must:
  - emit a rotating, flashing, yellow-coloured light;
  - flash between 120 and 200 times a minute;
  - have a power of at least 55 watts;
  - not be a strobe light; and
  - be clearly visible at a distance of 500 metres in all directions or else be supplemented by one or more additional warning lights so that light emanating from at least one of them is clearly visible at a distance of 500 metres in all directions.
- for travel during daylight (between sunrise and sunset), the perimeter of the trailer must be distinguished by warning flags which must be coloured red or yellow, or red and yellow and be at least 450mm long and 450mm wide, and must be positioned at each side of the front and rear of the silage trailer.

An oversize sign must be displayed on the front of the towing tractor.

The tractor must have its low-beam headlights on while travelling in the daytime.

### 15. Lights and Reflectors

Rear marking plates must be displayed on a towing vehicle exceeding 12.0 tonnes GVM and on a silage trailer exceeding 10.0 tonnes GTM. A rear marking plate must comply with rule 13.6.101 of third edition Australian Design Rule (ADR) 13/00.

The mandatory light requirements for a silage trailer are:

- a pair of direction indicator lights fitted on, or towards, its rear that face backwards. The direction indicator lights must incorporate a hazard warning signal;
- a pair of brake lights fitted to the rear of the trailer;
- at least one tail light fitted on or towards each side of the rear of the trailer;
- a front-facing white or yellow reflector fitted towards each side of the front of a trailer that is at least 2.2 metres wide;
- a rear-facing red rear reflector towards each side of its rear;
- a pair of side marker lights fitted to each side of a trailer that is at least 2.2 metres wide and not over 7.5 metres long; or at least 3 side marker lights fitted to each side of a trailer that is at least 2.2 metres wide and over 7.5 metres long. When on, a side marker light fitted towards the front of the vehicle must show yellow light, and must show a yellow or red light when fitted towards the rear of the vehicle.
- rear clearance lights on a trailer that is at least 2.2 metres wide that show a red light when switched on.

Lights that are optional on a silage trailer are:

- reversing lights;
- a pair of rear fog lights; or one rear fog light fitted on, or to the right, of the centre of the trailer.
- front clearance lights on a trailer at least 1.8 metres wide;
- side-facing reflectors. A side facing reflector towards the front of the trailer must be yellow or white; and towards the rear must be yellow or red; and on the central part must be yellow;
- additional front-facing reflectors.

All lights and lenses must be kept clean and in good working order.

Fitment, alignment and performance of lights and reflectors must comply with the requirements of Part 5, Schedule 2 of the Road Transport (Vehicle Registration) Regulation 2007.

## 16. Tyres

Tyres fitted to a silage trailer must be of sufficient size and capacity to carry the part of the silage trailer's gross mass transmitted to the ground through the axle, and must be free of any apparent defect that could make the vehicle unsafe. Tyres must be pneumatic and maximum inflation pressure must not exceed the pressure recommended by the manufacturer, and 825 kPa for a radial ply tyre or 700 kPa for another tyre.

Tyres on the same axle must not have differing carcass construction. On a trailer with a GVM in excess of 4.5 tonnes, the tyres must be suitable for road use at the lesser of:

- 100 km/h; and
- the vehicle's top speed.

## 17. Tow couplings, Towbars, Drawbars and Safety Chains

The mating parts of a coupling or a towbar must not be used for a load more than the manufacturer's load rating.

A coupling for attaching a trailer to a towing vehicle must be built and fitted so that the coupling is equipped with a positive locking mechanism (i.e. it cannot come loose from vibrations), and the positive locking mechanism can be released regardless of the angle of the trailer to the towing vehicle.

The trailer coupling must have clearly and permanently stamped, moulded or otherwise branded on its main component a means of identifying its manufacturer, and the maximum GTM of the trailer for which it is designed.

If the trailer is in a combination and is not fitted with break-away brakes, it must be connected to the towing vehicle by at least one chain, cable or other flexible device, as well as the required coupling.

Any safety connection must be as short as practicable and be so connected and affixed that:

- it is not liable to accidental disconnection but is readily detachable from the towing vehicle, and
- it permits all normal angular movements of the coupling without more slack than is necessary, and
- it will prevent the forward end of the drawbar from striking the ground in the event of accidental disconnection of the coupling, and
- if it consists of more than one chain or wire rope, the chains or wire ropes are in a crossed-over position.

Trailer couplings must incorporate safety chains in accordance with Australian Design Rule (ADR) 62/00, as set out in Table 4:

Table 4: Safety Chain Size Selection

Safety chains must be attached to trailers in a way that if the couplings or parts of couplings fail, the safety chains are still effective.

Note: For any silage trailers with an Aggregate Trailer Mass (ATM) over 3.5 tonnes, the safety chain must be made from a steel of a minimum of 800 MPa breaking stress, conforming to the mechanical properties of Grade T chain.

Towbars and drawbars must meet the requirements of Australian Design Rule (ADR) 62/00.

### 18. Suspension

The axles in an axle group fitted to a trailer with a GVM exceeding 4.5 tonnes must relate to each other through a load-sharing suspension system.

### 19. Mudguards

A silage trailer must be fitted with a mudguard for each wheel or for adjacent wheels, unless the body or part of the body acts as a mudguard, that reduces the danger of a person contacting the moving wheels.

On the rear wheels, the mudguard must:

- cover the overall tyre width of the wheel to which it is fitted; and
- be fitted so the height above ground level of the lowest edge of the rear of the mudguard is not more than one-third of the horizontal distance between the outer edge of the mudguard and the centre of the rearmost axle.

The outside of a rear mudguard that can be seen from the rear of the vehicle must be coloured white or silver if the trailer is at least 2.2 metres wide and is not fitted with rear marking plates.

**Restrictions**

Vehicles operating under the Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 (the Notice) may operate in the NSW Urban Zone and the NSW Regional Zone subject to the conditions set out in the Notice and any travel condition or restriction that applies in a Zone as set out in this Appendix.

**Part 1 - NSW Urban Zone**

For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Urban Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including the named roads,

- the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
- Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
- Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
- Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
- Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
- New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton, then south along
- Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then along the

- F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway to the Hawkesbury River bridge, then along the
- Hawkesbury River and the Nepean River to Cobbity, then a line drawn south from
- Cobbity to Picton, then via
- Picton Road and Mount Ousley Road (MR95) to the start of the F6 Southern Freeway at Mount Ousley, then via the
- F6 Southern Freeway to the Princes Highway at West Wollongong, then the
- Princes Highway and Illawarra Highway to Albion Park with a branch west on West Dapto Road to Tubemakers, then
- Tongarra Road to the Princes Highway, then
- Princes Highway south to the intersection of South Kiama Drive at Kiama Heights,

## 1.1 Travel Restrictions in the NSW Urban Zone

A vehicle operating under this Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 is permitted to operate in the NSW Urban Zone, subject to the travel conditions set out in this Part.

### 1.1.1 Clearway and transit lane travel

A vehicle must not travel in a Clearway or Transit Lane between the hours of 6.00 am and 10.00 am and between the hours of 3.00 pm and 7.00 pm.

**Note:** *Clearway and transit lane time restrictions can apply to just one side of the road or to both sides. Check prior to travel.*


### 1.1.2 Peak hour travel

A vehicle must not travel on any classified State Road within the NSW Urban Zone between Monday and Friday (except on a state-wide public holiday) between the hours of 7.00 am and 9.00 am and between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.

### 1.1.3 Peak hour travel – Newcastle Outer Zone

- (a) Despite Clause 1.1.2, vehicles not exceeding 3.2 metres in width may operate in the Newcastle Outer Zone during peak times. Vehicles exceeding 3.2 metres in width must not travel within the Newcastle Outer Zone on any classified State Road from Monday to Friday (except on a Statewide public holiday) between 7.00 am and 9.00 am or between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.
- (b) For the purposes of this Clause 1.1.3, the Newcastle Outer Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including:
- A line drawn from the Pacific Ocean at Glenrock Lagoon to the intersection of Pacific Highway and Northcott Drive (MR326),
  - Northcott Drive, Bridges Road, Turton Road, Hanbury Street (MR 326),
  - along the northern railway line to Watt Street and the Hunter River
  - the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
  - Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
  - Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
  - Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
  - Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
  - New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton,
  - Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then south along
  - F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway, through the intersection of the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway and Palmers Road, to the crossing of MR217 at Dora Creek
  - then Dora Creek and Lake Macquarie to the Pacific Ocean crossing the Pacific Highway at Swansea Bridge.

**Note:** The Newcastle Outer Zone is the area marked in yellow, excluding the Newcastle Inner Zone marked in orange.



### 1.1.4 Night travel

Night travel is permitted in the NSW Urban Zone subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Travel between sunset and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that is not wider than 3.1 metres or not longer than 14.5 metres; and
  - (ii) Any other special purpose vehicle that does not exceed 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length
- (b) Travel between midnight and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length.
  - (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length.

**Note:** Vehicles covered by paragraph 1.1.4(b) must operate with at least one pilot vehicle for night travel in accordance with the pilot vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.

### 1.1.5 Sundays and public holidays

Travel is not permitted after 4.00 pm on **Sundays or state-wide public holidays** on the following roads:

Hume Highway between the Picton Road interchange and the M7 and M5 interchange at Prestons
Western Motorway (M4) between the Nepean River at Emu Plains and Prospect
F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway between the Hawkesbury River and the Central Coast Highway interchange at Kariong

### 1.1.6 Public holiday periods (including 23 December to 3 January)

Travel is not permitted between sunrise and sunset during **public holiday periods** (including 23 December in one year to 3 January of the following year inclusive) on the following roads:

Great Western Highway – from Broadway to Nepean River Emu Plains
F1 Warringah Freeway – from Sydney Harbour Bridge to Willoughby Road Naremburn
M2 Hills Motorway – from North Ryde to Seven Hills
F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway – from Wahroonga to Beresfield
M4 Western Motorway – from Concord Road to Nepean River Leonay
F5 South Western Freeway – from Kyeemagh to Prestons
F6 Southern Freeway – from Waterfall to Yallah
M7 Westlink – from Seven Hills to Prestons
Gore Hill Freeway – Naremburn to Lane Cove

**Note:** A public holiday period means a period of three or more consecutive days covering a NSW public holiday as published in the NSW Government Gazette, and adjacent weekend days (for example Easter and every long weekend); or the period between 23 December in one year and 3 January in the following year (inclusive).

## 1.2 Limited Access Locations and Zones – NSW Urban Zone

- (a) Notwithstanding the dimension limits set out in the Notice travel on or through a Limited Access Location is not permitted if the vehicle exceeds one or more of the limits that applies to a Limited Access Location as set out in this Part.
- (b) A vehicle must comply with any access condition that applies to a Limited Access Location as set out in this Part.
- (c) A vehicle which exceeds one or more of the stated dimension limits must apply for and obtain a specific permit before travelling on or in any of the following Limited Access Locations in the NSW Urban Zone.
- (d) Where a dimension limit states Not Applicable (N/A) the dimension limit set out in the Notice is the applicable dimension.


### NSW URBAN ZONE - NEWCASTLE MAP

## Part 2 – NSW Regional Zone

- 2.1 For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Regional Zone is that part of the State of New South Wales that is not part of the area declared to be the NSW Urban Zone in Part 1 of this Appendix.
- 2.2 A vehicle may operate in the NSW Regional Zone subject to the travel conditions and restrictions as set out in this Part.
- 2.3 Week day and peak hour travel restrictions  
 Except where otherwise stated, a vehicle that exceeds 2.5 metres in width and 22 metres in length must not travel on the below locations contrary to the travel conditions set out in the following table:

- (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length, or
- (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length

**Note:** A vehicle to which paragraph 2.4.2 applies must operate with at least one pilot vehicle in accordance with the pilot and escort vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.

Vehicles operating under the Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 (the Notice) may operate in the NSW Urban Zone and the NSW Regional Zone subject to the conditions set out in the Notice and any travel condition or restriction that applies in a Zone as set out in this Appendix.

**Part 1 - NSW Urban Zone**

For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Urban Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including the named roads,

- the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
- Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
- Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
- Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
- Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
- New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton, then south along
- Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then along the

- F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway to the Hawkesbury River bridge, then along the
- Hawkesbury River and the Nepean River to Cobbity, then a line drawn south from
- Cobbity to Picton, then via
- Picton Road and Mount Ousley Road (MR95) to the start of the F6 Southern Freeway at Mount Ousley, then via the
- F6 Southern Freeway to the Princes Highway at West Wollongong, then the
- Princes Highway and Illawarra Highway to Albion Park with a branch west on West Dapto Road to Tubemakers, then
- Tongarra Road to the Princes Highway, then
- Princes Highway south to the intersection of South Kiama Drive at Kiama Heights,

## 1.1 Travel Restrictions in the NSW Urban Zone

A vehicle operating under this Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 is permitted to operate in the NSW Urban Zone, subject to the travel conditions set out in this Part.

### 1.1.1 Clearway and transit lane travel

A vehicle must not travel in a Clearway or Transit Lane between the hours of 6.00 am and 10.00 am and between the hours of 3.00 pm and 7.00 pm.

**Note:** *Clearway and transit lane time restrictions can apply to just one side of the road or to both sides. Check prior to travel.*


### 1.1.2 Peak hour travel

A vehicle must not travel on any classified State Road within the NSW Urban Zone between Monday and Friday (except on a state-wide public holiday) between the hours of 7.00 am and 9.00 am and between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.

### 1.1.3 Peak hour travel – Newcastle Outer Zone

- (a) Despite Clause 1.1.2, vehicles not exceeding 3.2 metres in width may operate in the Newcastle Outer Zone during peak times. Vehicles exceeding 3.2 metres in width must not travel within the Newcastle Outer Zone on any classified State Road from Monday to Friday (except on a Statewide public holiday) between 7.00 am and 9.00 am or between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.
- (b) For the purposes of this Clause 1.1.3, the Newcastle Outer Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including:
- A line drawn from the Pacific Ocean at Glenrock Lagoon to the intersection of Pacific Highway and Northcott Drive (MR326),
  - Northcott Drive, Bridges Road, Turton Road, Hanbury Street (MR 326),
  - along the northern railway line to Watt Street and the Hunter River
  - the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
  - Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
  - Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
  - Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
  - Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
  - New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton,
  - Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then south along
  - F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway, through the intersection of the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway and Palmers Road, to the crossing of MR217 at Dora Creek
  - then Dora Creek and Lake Macquarie to the Pacific Ocean crossing the Pacific Highway at Swansea Bridge.

**Note:** The Newcastle Outer Zone is the area marked in yellow, excluding the Newcastle Inner Zone marked in orange.



**1.1.4 Night travel**

Night travel is permitted in the NSW Urban Zone subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Travel between sunset and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that is not wider than 3.1 metres or not longer than 14.5 metres; and
  - (ii) Any other special purpose vehicle that does not exceed 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length
- (b) Travel between midnight and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length.
  - (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length.

**Note:** Vehicles covered by paragraph 1.1.4(b) must operate with at least one pilot vehicle for night travel in accordance with the pilot vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.



### NSW URBAN ZONE MAP




### NSW URBAN ZONE - NEWCASTLE MAP

## Part 2 – NSW Regional Zone

- 2.1 For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Regional Zone is that part of the State of New South Wales that is not part of the area declared to be the NSW Urban Zone in Part 1 of this Appendix.
- 2.2 A vehicle may operate in the NSW Regional Zone subject to the travel conditions and restrictions as set out in this Part.
- 2.3 Week day and peak hour travel restrictions

## 2.4 Night travel

Night travel is permitted in the NSW Regional Zone subject following conditions

2.4.1 Travel between sunset and sunrise is permitted for:

- (ii) Any other special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that does not exceed 2.5 metres or 22 metres in length.

2.4.2 Travel between midnight and sunrise is permitted for the following vehicles on the roads and areas set out in the table below:

- (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length, or
- (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length

**Note:** A vehicle to which paragraph 2.4.2 applies must operate with at least one pilot vehicle in accordance with the pilot and escort vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.

Vehicles operating under the Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 (the Notice) may operate in the NSW Urban Zone and the NSW Regional Zone subject to the conditions set out in the Notice and any travel condition or restriction that applies in a Zone as set out in this Appendix.

**Part 1 - NSW Urban Zone**

For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Urban Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including the named roads,

- the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
- Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
- Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
- Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
- Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
- New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton, then south along
- Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then along the

- F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway to the Hawkesbury River bridge, then along the
- Hawkesbury River and the Nepean River to Cobbity, then a line drawn south from
- Cobbity to Picton, then via
- Picton Road and Mount Ousley Road (MR95) to the start of the F6 Southern Freeway at Mount Ousley, then via the
- F6 Southern Freeway to the Princes Highway at West Wollongong, then the
- Princes Highway and Illawarra Highway to Albion Park with a branch west on West Dapto Road to Tubemakers, then
- Tongarra Road to the Princes Highway, then
- Princes Highway south to the intersection of South Kiama Drive at Kiama Heights,

## 1.1 Travel Restrictions in the NSW Urban Zone

A vehicle operating under this Class 1 Special Purpose Vehicle Notice 2012 is permitted to operate in the NSW Urban Zone, subject to the travel conditions set out in this Part.

### 1.1.1 Clearway and transit lane travel

A vehicle must not travel in a Clearway or Transit Lane between the hours of 6.00 am and 10.00 am and between the hours of 3.00 pm and 7.00 pm.

**Note:** *Clearway and transit lane time restrictions can apply to just one side of the road or to both sides. Check prior to travel.*


### 1.1.2 Peak hour travel

A vehicle must not travel on any classified State Road within the NSW Urban Zone between Monday and Friday (except on a state-wide public holiday) between the hours of 7.00 am and 9.00 am and between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.

### 1.1.3 Peak hour travel – Newcastle Outer Zone

- (a) Despite Clause 1.1.2, vehicles not exceeding 3.2 metres in width may operate in the Newcastle Outer Zone during peak times. Vehicles exceeding 3.2 metres in width must not travel within the Newcastle Outer Zone on any classified State Road from Monday to Friday (except on a Statewide public holiday) between 7.00 am and 9.00 am or between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.
- (b) For the purposes of this Clause 1.1.3, the Newcastle Outer Zone is defined as the area bounded by and including:
- A line drawn from the Pacific Ocean at Glenrock Lagoon to the intersection of Pacific Highway and Northcott Drive (MR326),
  - Northcott Drive, Bridges Road, Turton Road, Hanbury Street (MR 326),
  - along the northern railway line to Watt Street and the Hunter River
  - the Pacific Ocean and the North Channel of the Hunter River, then north from Stockton bridge along
  - Nelson Bay Road (MR108) to Williamtown, then west along
  - Cabbage Tree Road (MR302) to Masonite Road near Tomago, then along
  - Masonite Road to the Pacific Highway (HW10) at Heatherbrae, then south along the
  - Pacific Highway (HW10) to Hexham, then west along the
  - New England Highway (HW9) to Weakleys Drive Thornton,
  - Weakleys Drive to the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway at Beresfield, then south along
  - F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway, through the intersection of the F3 Sydney Newcastle Freeway and Palmers Road, to the crossing of MR217 at Dora Creek
  - then Dora Creek and Lake Macquarie to the Pacific Ocean crossing the Pacific Highway at Swansea Bridge.

**Note:** The Newcastle Outer Zone is the area marked in yellow, excluding the Newcastle Inner Zone marked in orange.



**1.1.4 Night travel**

Night travel is permitted in the NSW Urban Zone subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Travel between sunset and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that is not wider than 3.1 metres or not longer than 14.5 metres; and
  - (ii) Any other special purpose vehicle that does not exceed 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length
- (b) Travel between midnight and sunrise is permitted for:
  - (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length.
  - (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length.

**Note:** Vehicles covered by paragraph 1.1.4(b) must operate with at least one pilot vehicle for night travel in accordance with the pilot vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.

**1.1.5 Sundays and public holidays**

Travel is not permitted after 4.00 pm on **Sundays or state-wide public holidays** on the following roads:

Hume Highway between the Picton Road interchange and the M7 and M5 interchange at Prestons
Western Motorway (M4) between the Nepean River at Emu Plains and Prospect


### NSW URBAN ZONE - NEWCASTLE MAP

## Part 2 – NSW Regional Zone

- 2.1 For the purposes of this Part, the NSW Regional Zone is that part of the State of New South Wales that is not part of the area declared to be the NSW Urban Zone in Part 1 of this Appendix.
- 2.2 A vehicle may operate in the NSW Regional Zone subject to the travel conditions and restrictions as set out in this Part.
- 2.3 Week day and peak hour travel restrictions  
 Except where otherwise stated, a vehicle that exceeds 2.5 metres in width and 22 metres in length must not travel on the below locations contrary to the travel conditions set out in the following table:

## 2.4 Night travel

Night travel is permitted in the NSW Regional Zone subject following conditions

2.4.1 Travel between sunset and sunrise is permitted for:

- (i) A mobile crane that does not exceed 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length; or
- (ii) Any other special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that does not exceed 2.5 metres or 22 metres in length.

2.4.2 Travel between midnight and sunrise is permitted for the following vehicles on the roads and areas set out in the table below:

- (i) A mobile crane that exceeds 3.1 metres in width or 14.5 metres in length, or
- (ii) A special purpose vehicle or special purpose vehicle combination that exceeds 2.5 metres in width or 22 metres in length

**Note:** A vehicle to which paragraph 2.4.2 applies must operate with at least one pilot vehicle in accordance with the pilot and escort vehicle requirements as set out in Appendix 1 of this Notice.





  - (a) “GST” means any tax on goods and/or services, including any value-added tax, broad-based consumption tax or other similar tax introduced in Australia.  
“GST law” includes any Act, order, ruling or regulation, which imposes or otherwise deals with the administration or imposition of a GST in Australia.
  - (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement:
    - (i) If a GST applies to any supply made by either party under or in connection with this Agreement, the consideration provided or to be provided for that supply will be increased by an amount equal to the GST liability properly incurred by the party making the supply.
    - (ii) If the imposition of a GST or any subsequent change in the GST law is accompanied by or undertaken in connection with the abolition of or reduction in any existing taxes, duties or statutory charges (in this clause “taxes”), the consideration payable by the recipient of the supply made under this Agreement will be reduced by the actual costs of the party making the supply that are reduced directly or indirectly as a consequence of the abolition of or reduction in taxes.
- (7) The lessee must pay all rates and taxes assessed on or in respect of the land leased during the currency of the lease.
- (8) The lessee must hold and use the land leased bona fide for the lessee’s own exclusive benefit and shall not transfer, convey or assign the land or any portion thereof without having first obtained the written consent of the Minister.
- (9) The lessee must not enter into a sublease of the land leased unless the sublease specifies the purpose for which the land may be used under the sublease, and it is a purpose which is consistent with the purpose for which the land may be used under this lease.
- (10) If the lessee enters into a sublease of the land leased, the lessee must notify the Commissioner of the granting of the sublease within 28 days after it is granted.
- (11) The land leased must be used only for the purpose of Grazing and Cultivation (Irrigated).
- (12) The lessee must ensure that any irrigated cultivation activity is limited to on farm use only **except with the specific approval of the Commissioner**.
- (13) The lessee must maintain and keep in reasonable repair all improvements on the land leased during the currency of the lease and must permit the Minister or the Commissioner or any person authorised by the Minister or the Commissioner at all times to enter upon and examine the whole or any part of the land leased and the buildings or other improvements thereon.
- (14) The lessee must not erect or permit any person to erect any buildings or extend any existing buildings on the land leased except in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Council of the local government area.
- (15) The lessee must ensure that the land leased is kept in a neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner and not permit refuse to accumulate on the land.
- (16) Upon termination or forfeiture of the lease the Commissioner may direct that the former lessee remove any structure or material from the land at his own cost and without compensation. Where such a direction has been given the former lessee must leave the land in a clean and tidy condition free from rubbish and debris.
- (17) The lessee must, within 1 year from the date of commencement of the lease or such further period as the Commissioner may allow, enclose the land leased, either separately or conjointly with other lands held in the same interest, with a suitable fence to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

- (18) The lessee must not obstruct or interfere with any reserves, roads or tracks on the land leased, or the use thereof by any person.
- (19) The lessee must erect gates on roads within the land leased when and where directed by the Commissioner for public use and must maintain those gates together with approaches thereto in good order to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.
- (20) The right is reserved to the public of free access to, and passage along, the bank of any watercourse adjoining the land leased and the lessee must not obstruct access or passage by any member of the public to or along the bank.
- (21) Any part of a reserve for travelling stock, camping or water supply within the land leased must, during the whole currency of the lease, be open to the use of bona fide travellers, travelling stock, teamsters and carriers without interference or annoyance by the lessee and the lessee must post in a conspicuous place on the reserve a notice board indicating for public information the purpose of such reserve and, in fencing the land leased, the lessee must provide gates and other facilities for the entrance and exit of travelling stock, teamsters and others. The notice board, gates and facilities must be erected and maintained to the satisfaction of the Commissioner. The lessee must not overstock, wholly or in part, the areas leased within the reserve, the decision as to overstocking resting with the Commissioner.
- (22) The Crown shall not be responsible to the lessee or the lessee's successors in title for provision of access to the land leased.
- (23) The lessee must comply with requirements of section 18DA of the Western Lands Act 1901 which provides that except in circumstances referred to in subsection (3) of that section, cultivation of the land leased or occupied may not be carried out unless the written consent of the Department has first been obtained and any condition to which the consent is subject under subsection (6) is complied with.
- (24) The lessee must undertake any fuel management and/or provision of fire trail access in accordance with fire mitigation measures to the satisfaction of the NSW Rural Fire Service.
- (25) The lessee must, as the Commissioner may from time to time direct, foster and cultivate on the land leased such edible shrubs and plants as the Commissioner may consider can be advantageously and successfully cultivated.
- (26) Whenever so directed by the Commissioner, the lessee must, on such part or parts of the land leased as shall be specified in the direction, carry out agricultural practices, or refrain from agricultural practices, of such types and for such periods as the Commissioner may in the direction specify.
- (27) The lessee must not overstock, or permit or allow to be overstocked, the land leased and the decision of the Commissioner as to what constitutes overstocking shall be final and the lessee shall comply with any directions of the Commissioner to prevent or discontinue overstocking.
- (28) The lessee must, if the Commissioner so directs, prevent the use by stock of any part of the land leased for such periods as the Commissioner considers necessary to permit of the natural reseeding and regeneration of vegetation and, for that purpose, the lessee must erect within the time appointed by the Commissioner such fencing as the Commissioner may consider necessary.
- (29) The lessee must furnish such returns and statements as the Commissioner may from time to time require on any matter connected with the land leased or any other land (whether within or outside the Western Division) in which the lessee has an interest.
- (30) The lessee must, within such time as may be specified by the Commissioner take such steps and measures as the Commissioner shall direct to destroy vermin and such animals and weeds as may, under any Act, from time to time be declared (by declaration covering the land leased) noxious in the Gazette and must keep the land free of such vermin and noxious animals and weeds during the currency of the lease to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.
- (31) The lessee must not remove or permit any person to remove gravel, stone, clay, shells or other material for the purpose of sale from the land leased unless the lessee or the person is the holder of a quarry license under regulations made under the Crown Lands Act 1989 or, in respect of land in a State forest, unless the lessee or the person is the holder of a forest materials licence under the Forestry Act 1916, and has obtained the special authority of the Minister to operate on the land, but the lessee may, with the approval of the Commissioner, take from the land such gravel, stone, clay, shells or other material for building and other purposes upon the land as may be required by the lessee.
- (32) The lessee must ensure that cultivation and associated activities do not interfere with any road formation within or adjacent to the allowable area.
- (33) The lessee must not cultivate within the channel of incised drainage lines (other than man made structures) which carry water after storms in the channels, nor cultivate within a distance of 20 metres on either side of the banks of the channels, except when otherwise specified by the Western Lands Commissioner.
- (34) Except with the specific approval of the Commissioner, no cultivation or ancillary works associated with any cultivation must be undertaken within 60 metres, on the landward side, of the bank of the Warrego River. These areas are not to be disturbed by the use of any implements or used for the purposes of any silo, temporary grain storage, machinery shed or other installations or works of any kind.
- (35) The lessee must establish windbreaks at his/her own expense, as may be ordered by the Western Lands Commissioner to provide adequate protection of the soil.
- (36) The lessee must ensure that stubble and other crop residue is retained on the soil surface and must not be burnt, except with the written approval of the Western Lands Commissioner or his delegate. Where such approval is granted, stubble burning must be carried out with the approval as per requirements of the NSW Rural Fire Services.

- (37) The lessee must undertake any appropriate measures, at his/her own expense, ordered by the Commissioner to rehabilitate any degraded cultivated areas.
- (38) The lessee must ensure that sandhills and other soils with a surface texture of loamy sand or coarser are left uncultivated unless specifically approved by the commissioner.
- (39) The lessee must not permanently transfer water from the lease without the prior written permission of the Western Lands Commissioner.
- (40) The lessee must ensure land within 60 metres of any texture contrast or duplex soil area remains uncultivated except in accordance with a plan approved by the Commissioner. Texture contrast (or duplex) soils are soil types which have a sandy to loamy topsoil abruptly overlaying a clay subsoil and are prone to scalding (producing claypans and hummocks).
- (41) The lessee must ensure areas with a slope greater than 2% remain uncultivated until any soil conservation measures documented in a plan approved by the Commissioner have been implemented at the lessee expense.
- (42) The lessee must ensure that cultivation and cropping do not to alter the natural flood regime or obstruct the reasonable passage of floodwaters. Crops are not to be protected by levees.
- (43) The lessee is authorised to cultivate an area of 686 hectares as indicated by the cross-hatched area shown on the diagram below. Cultivation is only allowed within the area indicated. Cultivation outside this area will only be allowable with the written consent of the Commissioner or Minister.
- (44) The lessee must ensure that no tail water or drainage water run-off will escape or discharge into or onto adjoining lands by any means including surface or sub-surface drains or pipes.
