



1. The accompanying Statements of the Treasurer's Receipts and Disbursements during the year 1892 were received on the 30th March, for examination, were returned for correction and suggested amendments on the 29th June, and were finally received back from the Treasury on the 16th August, but were not so fully altered as desired. The suggested amendments which have not been acceded to are of some importance, and will be noticed in their respective places. I have now the honor to submit to the Legislative Assembly, as directed by the 38th Section of the Audit Act of 1870, with the Treasurer's Statements, the following Report and explanations thereupon, so far as they refer to the Receipts and Payments within the year 1892.

4. The disturbing element which has affected the Revenue Balance since the anticipatory credit of £616,784 in 1890 has now been removed by writing back £21,000 excess of credit, and by placing the remaining unnegotiated balance of Treasury Deficiency Bills for £129,000 to the credit of the Government Savings Bank Account, leaving the whole amount of the Treasury Deficiency Bills outstanding as £2,052,884 at the close of the year.

The Cash Overdraft shown by the Treasurer's Statement is £483,726 15s. 8d., but this includes £450,000 transfer from the Deficiency Debt of 1886 and previous years to the Current Account for the years 1890, 1891, and 1892, thus leaving the amount of the original deficit for which the Treasury Bills were issued as it was. A continuation of the Statement given with the Report on the Accounts of 1890 shows the result of the cash operations on the Revenue Account from 1887 to 1892, including the Cash Overdraft at 31st December, 1886 (from which date the Deficiency Account was computed), as follows, viz.:—

- 5. Exclusive of the amount borrowed from the Trust Fund on the security of the Treasury Deficiency Bills the cash deficiency at 31st December, 1892, thus appeared as £2,536,610 15s. 8d.; deducting from this the outstanding negotiated Treasury Bills, £2,052,884, there remains the cash overdraft as shown above—£483,726 15s. 8d. Giving the Revenue Account credit for the unrecovered issues on account, as detailed in paragraph 2, £973,881 17s. 1d., the overdraft on what may be termed the final account of Revenue transactions at 31st December, 1892, is reduced to the amount already stated above as £1,562,728 18s. 7d.
- 6. An important adjustment has, however, yet to be made between the Revenue Account proper and the General Loan Account. This was referred to in my last Report, where it may be seen that the proceeds of certain loans included the amount of interest payable from the Revenue between the dates from which the securities sold bore interest, and the several dates at which the purchasers paid their instalments upon their tenders. The amount of such back interest unquestionably formed part of the price tendered, and is thus payable to the Revenue which is chargeable, and has in fact been already charged, with it. The total amount thus transferable from the General Loan Account to the Revenue is, so far as ascertainable, £420,811 17s. 3d. Of this amount, however, there has been already credited a sum of £10,413 15s. 5d., but improperly described as a "Premium" on a certain Loan. This will be more fully explained in the remarks on the General Loan Account further on.
- 7. Even with this credit, on the other hand, the Revenue Account will not only remain overdrawn, but all claims upon the undischarged balances of Votes and other liabilities, as they stood at the close of the year will have to be met, and to a considerable amount have already been met, out of the growing produce of the Revenue as those claims mature. A reference to Appendix A shows that such estimated outstanding liabilities aggregated £1,840,639 5s. 6d.
- 8. This condition of the Account makes it clear that it is useless to draw distinctions between the payments for Arrear or Current Services when they have always to be made out of the current Revenue for the time being. No appropriation of the Revenue, whether by the Annual Appropriation Acts, or by any Act otherwise creating a liability upon it, limits such liability to the Revenue of any particular year, and, if it did, it would in very many cases render the enactment futile.
- 9. This question has occurred in connection with two entries at page 28 of the Treasurer's Statement which the Colonial Treasurer has classified as arrears of 1891. The one is a charge under the head of Newcastle Sand Drift Reclamation, 50 Victoria No. 22, of £12,684–18s. 7d. for Reclamation of Land and Interest on deferred payment of compensation for the same. It was pointed out to the Treasurer that as the completion of the transaction dated 30th June, 1892, it should be classified as for 1892 as usual with Unfixed Statutory Liabilities, and, moreover, that there was no Vote of Parliament for the item assigning the charge to any year's service, although the liability originated so far back as 1886. The Colonial Treasurer has demurred to my view of the matter, claiming that the "Revenue of 1892" is not liable. Nevertheless, the 5th clause of the Act quoted distinctly makes the Consolidated Revenue Fund liable for expenses whenever they may be incurred under it.

- Crown Rents Act of 1890," and "Interest," as provided for by clause 6 of that Act, 54 Victoria No. 11. "Revenue Refunded" is always classified as a charge upon the current year's revenue, with the exception of the special Vote taken in 1889 of £165,000 for refunds to pastoral lessees. As in the former case, there is no Vote limiting the charge for refunds to any year's revenue, and as the Act, 54 Victoria No. 11, sufficiently authorises the payment of the interest, a vote for interest in this connection of £18,000 in the Supplementary Estimates of 1891 is surplusage, and is so treated in the Treasurer's statement.
- 11. The Colonial Treasurer has in this instance also declined to adopt my suggestion, pleading that it would interfere with his Ways and Means Statements. As those statements are not embodied in any enactment of Parliament, they furnish me with no authority to depart from the usual method of classification. The items in question are therefore treated in Appendix A as transactions of 1892. This question of the mode of dealing with the account of revenue is of some importance, and I have, therefore, deemed it advisable to append to this Report the correspondence which has taken place on the subject, and to which special attention is requested. (Vide Appendices B and C.)
- 12. The Revenue Cash Account therefore closed at 31st December, 1892, with an overdraft of £2,536,610 15 But subject to the following credits, viz.:-Issues on Account recoverable £973,881 17 Balance of Accrued Interest due by the General Loan Account 410,398 1 10 Absolute premium on Loan raised under the Loan Act, 41 Vic. No. 7 24,460 0 3 1,408,739 19 £1,127,870 16

These figures are of course exclusive of the temporary relief afforded by the Trust Fund loans on Treasury Bills for £2,052,884 now outstanding but redeemable at the rate of £150,000 annually. Unless, however, the Revenue Account can show a balance credit to that amount at the 31st December, when the annual redemption is required to be made, the Bills may be extinguished by the operation of clause 6 of the Act 53 Victoria No. 9, but the debt to the Trust Fund would not, to that extent, be diminished.

- 13. The allotment of £1,500 in Schedule F to the Vote 308 of 1892 for Military Works, to the sub-head of Repairs, Alterations, Additions, &c., to Military Buildings, having been found insufficient for that service, a further sum of £4,231 7s. 4d., not required for other estimated works, was temporarily applied to meet the deficiency under the authority of the Governor and Executive Council. That authority has since been confirmed by a vote taken for the amount on the Supplementary Estimates for 1892, not however, it is understood, as an addition to the original vote of £15,040, but simply to provide the sanction of Parliament to the temporary variation of the details given in Schedule F. (Vide Appendix D.)
- 14. The Appropriation Act for 1892 not having been passed until three months of the year had expired, Temporary Supply Acts, granting £974,900 for January, and £644,900 for February, were required to provide for the payments falling due in those months; but as the first of those Acts was not passed until



February, sums, amounting in all to £168,001 13s. 9d., had been issued by the Colonial Treasurer in anticipation of Parliamentary sanction during the period 24th December, 1891, to 4th February, 1892. To cover those payments, made "without Appropriation and Warrant," there was passed the "Treasury Indemnity Act, 1892."

#### THE TRUST FUND ACCOUNT.

- 15. The total balance at the credit of the General Trust Fund Account has been reduced during the year from £4,514,947 10s. 8d. to £3,906,300 3s. 11d., a difference of £608,647 6s. 9d., arising chiefly from the repayment of £300,000 advances by banks in London, £100,000 to the Bank of New Zealand, and of £240,000 to the Savings Bank of New South Wales. Those transactions occur in the Special Deposits Account, of which an abstract is given at page 103, wherein also may be seen the variations in the balances of other Trust Accounts, none of which appears to call for any special remark.
- 16. The remaining balance at credit on the 31st December consisted of securities lodged in the Treasury Chest (which were verified on inspection) to the amount of £2,362,527 12s. 3d., and of £600 on account of the Lunacy Trust deposited in the Commercial Bank of Sydney (see page 5), of advances to the Consolidated Revenue Fund, £483,726 15s. 8d., and of £618,791 2s. 2d. to the General Loan Account, leaving a working cash balance of £440,654 13s. 10d.
- 17. Two new separate Accounts appear in this year's Statement in connection with the Supreme Court Trust Moneys, viz.:—The "Colonial Treasurer's Curator of Intestate Estates Account" and the "Colonial Treasurer's Prothonotary Account." These Accounts have hitherto formed part of the "Trust Moneys Deposit Account," under the Act 20 Victoria, No. 11.
- 18. The Combined Balances of the Supreme Court Trust Moneys at the close of the year, excepting those of the Official Assignees in Insolvency, amounted to £480,456 ls. ld., and are subject to the payment by the Government of 4 per cent. interest on the current daily balance; £353,784 being invested in Treasury Bills at that rate. The Accounts of these moneys are not subject to audit, being operated upon outside the Public Account. The figures given are, therefore, those quoted by the Colonial Treasurer, which agree however with the Bank Accounts, but they are not covered by my certificate.
- 19. The Civil Service Superannuation Account shows an improvement in the Cash Balance of £31,117 11s. 8d., the total at credit being now shown as £464,376 15s. 4d.; of that sum £330,000 are invested in Treasury Bills carrying 4 per cent. interest. The amount credited to this fund as ordinary income was (deducting refunds) £89,992 4s. 3d., an increase of £2,746 3s. 5d. over the previous year. The ordinary charges for pensions and gratuities paid within the year, deducting £3,785 10s. 8d., contributed by the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the gratuities, amounted to £68,752 3s. 5d., thus showing as compared with the cash receipts a margin to credit of £21,240 0s. 10d. upon the year's accounts.
- 20. New pensions were granted to the amount annually of £7,288 18s. 9d., while deaths reduced the Pension List by the amount of £3,030 4s., exclusive of £290 occurring in the Schedule B List. The annual rate of pensions payable under

the Civil Service Act at the 31st December was therefore £66,510 6s. 6d., inclusive of those specially chargeable to Schedule B. Lists of the new and lapsed pensions are given in *Appendix* E. The net amount of gratuities paid in 1892 was less than in 1891 by £1,619 2s. 10d.

- 21. The Police Superannuation Fund shows an excess of disbursements over income within the year of £10,277 3s. 1d., making its own balance on the debtor side of £3,503 2s. 7d., but a supplement of £16,000 from the Police Reward Fund created a credit balance of £12,496 17s. 5d.
- 22. The Police Reward Fund has added to its credit a difference in favour of income over expenditure of £6,974 4s., augmenting the balance on its own account from £32,702 11s. 9d. at the close of 1891, to £39,676 15s. 9d., but having contributed £16,000 to supplement the deficiency in the Police Superannuation Fund, the balance credit was reduced to £23,676 15s. 9d.
- 23. The united incomes of both the above funds for the year aggregate £17,484 5s. 6d., and the total issues £20,787 4s. 7d., reducing thus the joint balance at 31st December, 1892, to £36,173 13s. 2d., of which £32,000 were invested in Debentures and Treasury Bills. New pensions were granted in 1892 at a gross annual rate of £1,593 6s., and at the same rate the lapsed pensions amounted to £1,321 12s., showing the small addition of £271 14s. to the list of outstanding Police pensions, which now shows a gross annual rate of £17,950 6s. 3d.
- 24. The Railway Loan Redemption Fund has been augmented to £150,000, by the credit to it of a second instalment of £75,000 from the Consolidated Revenue Fund, towards the redemption of one million pounds of the Public Debt for Railways incurred for "Reconstruction and Improvement of Rolling Stock and Permanent Way," under the Loan Act, 53 Victoria No. 23, but no debentures have as yet been issued to cover the expenditure of that Vote.

#### THE TREASURER'S ADVANCE ACCOUNT.

- 25. At the close of 1891 the Treasurer's Advance Vote required for its adjustment £267,696 12s. 5d., that is to say, £67,696 12s. 5d. on account of the Vote for 1890, and £200,000 the ordinary Vote for 1891. The former of those sums has been cleared by a repayment in 1892 to the Revenue Account, and £150,000 of the Vote of 1891 has been adjusted in like manner, chiefly by means of the Supplementary Estimates included in the Appropriation Act of 1892, which was not passed until the 1st April. By a similar delay in regard to the Appropriation Act of 1893, with its Supplementary Votes for 1892 and previous years, the balance of £50,000 upon the Vote for 1891, together with the ordinary Vote of £200,000 for the year 1892, and an additional Vote of £100,000, in anticipation of the Supplementary Estimates, made a total advance to the Treasurer of £350,000 outstanding for adjustment.
- 26. As the Treasurer had at the close of the year a cash balance on his Advance Account of £17,311 4s. 6d., the amount actually used and outstanding for advance purposes was, at the 31st December, £332,688 15s. 6d. For that sum a detailed statement is given in *Appendix* F, showing the several purposes to which the issues had been applied. The greater part of those advances have now been adjusted by means of the Appropriation Act of this year.

### THE GENERAL LOAN ACCOUNT.

- 27. Towards replenishing the General Loan Account which was overdrawn at the close of 1891 to the amount of £1,305,157 4s. 8d., authority was given by the "Treasury Bills Act of 1891," 55 Victoria No. 7, to raise four million pounds sterling by the issue of Treasury Bills, with a maximum currency of four years, and at a maximum rate of interest of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum. By the "Funded Stock Act of 1892," 56 Victoria No. 1, a further authority was given for the sale in the Colony at par of Funded Stock to a maximum amount of three million pounds sterling—the said Stock to be redeemable at the option of the Government, after the expiration of twenty years from the passing of the Act (28th October, 1892). The total amount raised and credited under the above Acts during the year 1892 was £3,215,344 12s. 9d. There was also a nominal credit of £294,200 representing only an exchange in London of matured debentures for Inscribed Stock at par.
- 28. In addition to those new sources of replenishment, there was credited the balance of the loan of September, 1891, quoted as £2,001,015 14s. 7d.; but the total amount of those credits fell short of the expenditure during the year, together with the overdraft for 1891, leaving the account still overdrawn at the close of it by the sum of £618,791 2s. 2d., according to the Treasury Statement.
- 29. It may be seen, however, from previous remarks on the Revenue Account (paragraph 6) that this overdraft should more properly be increased by the transfer to the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the sums there specified as due to it for accrued interest and premium, neither of which items can be considered as part of the money borrowed for expenditure on Loan Services. In every case where Securities have been sold in the Colony, at a date later than that from which those Securities made the Revenue liable for interest, the amount accrued due during the interval has been collected from the purchasers and credited to the Revenue Account.
- 30. The amounts so credited (including £10,122 16s. 3d. arising out of the first loan negotiated in London through the Bank of New South Wales in 1856) are ascertained to aggregate £28,338 2s. 11d. This principle is understood to operate universally in the purchase and sale of Interest-bearing Securities in the open market—the price being always affected by the dates of negotiation. A detailed Statement is appended showing the amounts of accrued interest included in the credits to the General Loan Account on the Loans obtained under the Acts, 41 Victoria No. 7 to 54 Victoria No. 33. (Appendix G.)
- 31. The total amount thus shown to have been credited in excess to the General Loan Account for accrued interest is £420,811 17s. 3d., as referred to in paragraphs 31 and 32 of my Report on the Accounts of 1891. Correspondence has taken place with the Treasury with the view to have this overcredit corrected, but as yet without effect—the Treasury views being apparently based upon a misconception of the relationship subsisting between the revenue proper and moneys borrowed on its security. (Vide Appendix H.)
- 32. The amount above stated includes a sum of £10,413 15s. 5d., which has been transferred to the Revenue Account during the past year, not, however, as accrued interest, but as a "premium" supposed to have been obtained on the negotiation of the Loan of £1,390,600 under the Act, 52 Victoria No. 16. This description was doubtless given to the item in my Report on the Accounts of 1890,

but it was not then known to arise from the fact that the price obtained for the Loan included accrued interest to the amount of £16,288 2s. 3d.; this, with the charges of negotiation £23,002 6s. 7d., reduces the net proceeds of the Loan to £1,384,725 13s. 2d.\*

- 33. Before, however, the question arose as to the mode of dealing with the accrued interest, and under the view that the sum shown in the Treasurer's Statement of the Public Debt for 1890, £10,413 15s. 5d. as "Over-raised," was really an excess over the amount authorised to be raised by the Loan Act, 52 Victoria No. 16, the Treasurer was asked to transfer it as in previous cases to the Consolidated Revenue Fund; but, on the assumption that he was entitled to use an excess of the kind to reduce sums otherwise "Short-raised" by the authority of the Loans Fund Amalgamation Act, 42 Victoria No. 16, the Treasurer declined to make the transfer.
- 34. The case was accordingly submitted for the opinion of the Attorney-General as a case of "Premium," and, in that view of it, the Attorney-General supported my contention that the money was not properly Loan Money at all, and could not be dealt with as the Treasury proposed. The opinion of the Attorney-General as given to me did not quite satisfy the Treasury, and thus a further opinion was elicited, which sustained in stronger terms the view, which really underlies the whole case, that only money which is actually "raised" and applicable to expenditure for Loan Services can be considered as money borrowed.
- 35. As respects the particular sum in question, therefore, the Treasury at length relieved the Loan Account of it; but on the broad principles laid down by the Attorney-General, the Treasurer, it seems to me, is bound to relieve the Loan Account also of the sum it now has at its credit for accrued interest, but the amount of which has already been paid away by the Revenue to the holders of the Securities out of the increased price received from them to cover it—or, in other words, the Revenue has contributed to the General Loan Account a sum of £420,811 17s. 3d. but which does not appear in the Statements in that shape.

As this question is of some importance, it seems proper to attach to the Attorney General's opinion the correspondence out of which it was asked for and given. (Vide Appendix I.)

- 36. A real case of "Premium" occurs, however, in regard to the Loan raised under the Loan Act, 41 Victoria No. 7. Debentures for the full amount authorised by that Act, £1,120,000, were negotiated, with the result that the gross proceeds realized £1,158,624 17s. 10d. Deducting the accrued interest, £7,462 11s. 5d., and the charges for negotiation, £6,702 6s. 2d., there remained £1,144,460 0s. 3d., showing an absolute premium of £24,460 0s. 3d., which, under the opinion of the Attorney-General, must be transferred to the Revenue Account. The attention of the Treasurer has been directed to this.
- 37. The proceeds of the Treasury Bills sold in London are stated at £2,238,748 7s. 3d. for two parcels—one of £1,250,000, bearing interest at 4 per cent. from the 1st of January, 1892, and another of £1,000,000, bearing interest at the same rate from

from the 1st of July, 1892. For the first parcel the gross proceeds were £1,247,918 6s. 1d., but, not having been sold until the 1st February, there had accrued the interest for the month of January, £4,166 13s. 4d., and for a portion paid one day late £1 12s. 9d. This latter sum has improperly been applied to reduce charges for stationery, &c.; and in contrast to the procedure in regard to accrued interest on ordinary Loans the former amount of £4,166 13s. 4d. has been credited to the Trust Fund, under the head of Sundry Deposits, and applied from that Fund in part payment of the interest, which, in terms of the Bills themselves, is payable from the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

- 38. The transactions accordingly appear neither in the Loan nor in the Revenue Account, and the same is the case with the smaller sum of £1 12s. 9d. Undoubtedly the accrued interest ought to have been credited to the Revenue Account and the amount due at 30th June to have been paid in full from that Account. Apart from these additions, the proceeds proper of the Bills themselves, £1,243,750, show a discount of 10s. per cent., but being subject to charges of negotiation to the amount of £3,753 5s. 6d., the rate of net produce was reduced to £99 4s. 0d. nearly.
- 39. The second parcel of £1,000,000 appears free of accrued interest, and was nominally sold at 5s. per cent. premium, but the charges of negotiation appearing as £3,750, the net proceeds credited were £998,750, or at a rate of £99 17s. 6d. per cent.
- 40. The sale of Funded Stock in the Colony commenced on the 8th November, and the amount sold to the close of the year reached only the amount of £227,000, being sold at par and bearing interest (at 4 per cent.) only from the date of each sale. The actual credit was reduced to £226,596 5s. 6d. by a charge of one quarter per cent. as Brokers' Commission.
- 41. A difficulty has occurred with regard to the mode of accounting for the proceeds of the Treasury Bills. The Treasury Bills Act of 1891 is obviously a temporary Act to provide Loan Money in anticipation of the raising of definite Loans on the authority of specific Loan Acts already passed at the date of that Act. But while thus limited, there is no provision for the allotment of moneys so temporarily raised to any particular Acts or classes of services by which it can be determined to what extent any particular authorised Loan has been anticipated by the sale of Treasury Bills.

On referring to clause 10 of the Act it appears evident that it was intended to credit the proceeds of the Bills, not, as in the ordinary Loan Acts, to the "General Loan Account," but to "a General Loan Fund Account," which would thus become available as a drawing account for specific application as required until regular Loans were negotiated. There is, moreover, an inconsistency between the wording of the 4th and the 10th clauses—the latter making the money raised applicable to "such Loan Services as have been" "or may hereafter be authorised by Parliament."

42. The proceeds of the Bills sold have, nevertheless, been credited to the "General Loan Account" without specific application, and that process has rendered it impossible to state how this temporary loan money has been applied. Seeing this difficulty, the Treasurer's attention was called to it by letter from this office, dated 10th March last, suggesting that a separate Fund Account should be opened, as directed in clause 10, and be operated upon by drafts to meet deficiencies

of funds as they arose under specific Acts in connection with the "General Loan Account." The Treasurer having declined to adopt my suggestion, I then requested to be informed on account of what specific Loan Acts the Treasury Bills had been negotiated, and to what amount for each Act, but this request has not been complied with. (Vide Appendix J.)

- 43. A like difficulty occurs with the moneys raised under the "Funded Stock Act of 1892," inasmuch as they are only applicable to loan services for which authority has been given by previous Loan Acts to raise the requisite sums by loans. Without, therefore, a specific credit of moneys raised by the sale of stock to a particular Loan Service Act, there is no definite connection between the moneys borrowed and the authorised services. Moreover, in the case of this Act, while the moneys raised are directed to be placed to the credit of the "General Loan Account" these moneys are also made applicable to Loan Services which "may hereafter be authorised by Parliament," a provision which is calculated to make the Statements of Loan Receipts and Disbursements complicated and difficult to follow.
- 44. There is also another complication arising out of the Limitation clause which has been inserted in every Loan Act since the Loan Act of 1884, 48 Victoria No. 26. The clause runs as follows, viz.:—
  - "Nothing in this Act contained, or in the Act forty-second Victoria number sixteen, shall authorise the use of any money borrowed thereunder for works or services other than those named therein and approved by "Parliament in terms of the Act fifty-first Victoria number thirty-seven."

The Acts in which the above clause is inserted are 52 Victoria No. 17, 53 Victoria No. 23, 54 Victoria No. 33, 55 Victoria No. 35; but although large expenditure had taken place up to the close of the year under all the above-named Acts, the only money actually borrowed in connection with either of them has been the Loan of September, 1891, for services named in 54 Victoria No. 33. The very extensive application of moneys borrowed for specific services under one Act to the services of another has abundantly exemplified the propriety of limiting the use of moneys borrowed to the purposes for which it is borrowed, as defined by the clause above quoted, and also of exempting the "Loans Fund Amalgamation Act of 1879" from any interpretation which would interfere with such limitation.

- 45. The fact that most of the sums negotiated in recent years have been for round sums on account, instead of for specific application to services in terms of the Loan Acts, points to the advisability of creating by Act of Parliament a Loan Fund, on the security of and as a supplement to the Consolidated Revenue Fund, to be raised by authorising round sums for "classes" of services, the said Fund to be operated upon by separate Acts appropriating the loan moneys thus provided to special works or services.
- 46. The unsatisfactory condition of the Loan Service Accounts, more particularly of the loan operations subsequently to the Act 46 Victoria No. 23, and commencing with the Loan Act of 1884, 48 Victoria No. 26, has for the present rendered it impracticable to carry out the intention, expressed in my Report of last year, to submit a comprehensive statement of the Loan Account in all the leading features of interest from the commencement in 1842 to date.
- 47. The fact of upwards of three million pounds sterling having been borrowed without any authorised specific application to services, and the further 30—U

fact of the diversion of some eight million pounds sterling, raised for the purposes of the Loan Act of 1884, to other services, are sufficient to show that no proper relationship has been maintained between the authorities to borrow, and the actual application of moneys so borrowed, to the purposes for which the lenders were informed they were to be applied. In these circumstances legislation may probably be necessary to adjust matters in regard to the Loan Act of 1884, 48 Victoria No. 26.

48. There is, moreover, in the limitation clause referred to above, a strong implication that only moneys authorised to be borrowed by the Acts in which the clause occurs are to be used for the purposes set forth in those Acts. It is further implied consequently that no expenditure should be entered upon in connection therewith prior to the Loans proper thereto being negotiated.

49. The historical statement of the negotiation of loans appended to my report on the accounts of 1884 has now been remodelled in certain respects, and carried on to the end of 1892. That Statement, with a supplement showing the operation of the conditions for the redemption of the million loan of 1867 to the close of 1892 forms *Appendix* K to this Report.

50. There is also appended (Appendix M) an abstract statement of the Public Debt of the Colony as it stood at 31st December, 1892, showing the Services for which it was incurred, upon as accurate a computation as circumstances will allow, the dates at which the respective portions of it fall due for repayment, and the annual rate and amount of interest payable for each class of Service respectively. The Statement does not include the Treasury Deficiency Bills issued under the Act 53 Victoria No. 9, inasmuch as they do not represent money borrowed from the Public in the same way as the General Loans are for expenditure upon Public Works, but represent only a departmental obligation arising out of an overdraft on the Revenue Account as already explained elsewhere. The total outstanding debt is therefore shewn as £51,955,889 9s. 2d., and the total annual interest payable from 1st January, 1893, was £1,983,745 11s. 6d.

51. The total net disbursements for Loan Services to the 31st December, 1892, were for the following classes of service, viz.:—

The Loan Vote under 54 Victoria No. 33, of £25,000, "Towards acquisition of land for Public Parks in various parts of the Colony," is, however, understood to be abandoned, and the proposed expenditure to be met out of the Revenue Account, towards which a vote of £10,000 is included in the Appropriation Act of 1892, item No. 296.

#### THE RAILWAY ACCOUNTS.

53. The gross receipts from Railway and Tramway Tolls and Miscellaneous Collections in connection therewith actually credited at the Treasury during the year 1892 amounted to £3,416,496 4s. 4d., as given at page 10; but there have to be set off against that sum the usual refunds to the extent, within the year, of £30,493 18s. 4d. The particulars of those refunds are detailed at page 41, under the head of Revenue Refunded. The net produce of the Railway income was, therefore, £3,386,002 6s. 0d., so far as represented by the Treasury Cash Accounts during the year 1892.

54. The expenditure out of Revenue during 1892, for working and all other ordinary expenses of the Railways and Tramways, including second instalment of £75,000 in redemption of £1,000,000 voted under the Loan Act 53 Victoria No. 23, less recredits, amounted to £2,262,618 8s. 5d., compiled according to the lines shown in the Supplement to Appendix E to last year's Report, thus showing on the year's operations a net credit balance of £1,123,383 17s. 7d. The interest on expenditure computed on the principles explained in paragraphs 48 to 51 of last year's Report, and carried on to the close of 1892, amounts to £1,411,745 17s. 9d., thus exceeding the credit balance above stated by £288,362 0s. 2d.

The total disbursements charged to Loan Appropriations for Railway and Tramway purposes stood as £37,417,318 16s. 2d. at 31st December. A continuation for 1892 of the figures given last year representing the progressive expenditure and income of the Railways and Tramways from 1850 to 1891 will be found in Appendix L.

#### LOCAL INSPECTION OF RAILWAY STATION ACCOUNTS.

55. As distinguished from the Treasurer's Statements of Cash Receipts on account of the Railways and Tramways, the balance statement of earnings by these services in 1892, compiled by my Inspectors from material gathered in the course of

their local examinations of the Railway-station Accounts, show the following result, viz.:—

The local inspection has not presented any unusual features, and has been carried on in satisfactory official relationship with the Railway Commissioners.

- 56. The number of Collecting Railway Stations and Offices visited and inspected during the year was 280 out of 309 open at the close of 1892, and the remainder were disposed of early in the present year. Of the whole number of visits 33 only were more or less unsatisfactory, a decrease of 7 upon those of like character during last year, while 247 inspections were satisfactory, as against 192 more or less satisfactory visits in 1891, an increase of 55. These results show a very considerable improvement in the condition and management of the business entrusted to the Station-masters and their assistants.
- 57. The Annual Report furnished to me by my Inspecting Officers supplies as usual full details of their work, and of the many interesting and some intricate questions arising out of matters connected, among others, with platform and sidings traffic, especially on the Southern and South-Western Lines, methods of invoicing, receipt-books, parcels stamps, special ticket rates for the Press and Commercial Travellers, credit accounts, cash remittances, refunds, rebates on grain and flour traffic. Space will not allow on this occasion of entering upon the questions referred to, but it is justly due to the Officers engaged on this special duty to say that they continue to exhibit the same energy, efficiency, and keenness, in prosecuting their inquiries, to which I have before had great pleasure in bearing testimony, and can only repeat my regret that they are not better remunerated than they are.
- 58. The Additional Assistant Inspector, provided for a portion of the past year, could not well be appointed until too late to afford any material assistance within the year. Even with his help, however, it is feared that the additional stations in course of being opened will make it necessary, at an early date, to ask for further aid, more especially in the indoor work required to follow up the notes taken at the outdoor inspections.
- 59. The authority of the Governor-in-Council has been furnished for a number of cases of changes in rates of tolls in satisfaction of queries by this Department. A list of such authorities is given in *Appendix* O. There is still, however, a considerable number of queries as to rates of charges for passenger and goods traffic, for which, as yet, the requisite explanations or authorities have not been received.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

60. The usual Certificates of Discharge have been issued to the Treasurer under clause 28 of the Audit Act. The amounts disallowed are specified in Appendix P.

61. The Mint Bullion Accounts and the Accounts of the Government Savings' Bank have been examined and certified to agree with the books and

vouchers representing the same.

- 62. In accordance with clause 88 of the Wollongong Harbour Trust Act of 1889, the books and accounts of the Wollongong Harbour Trust Commissioners were examined for the first time in July, 1892, for the periods respectively from the 1st October, 1889, to the 31st December, 1890, and from the 1st January to the 31st December, 1891. The Commissioners' statements of their receipts and disbursements for those periods were compared on the spot with the books and supporting documents, and copies of those statements, with my certificate to their correctness, were laid before Parliament in October last.

- 65. The greater portion of the foregoing particulars of defaulters has been supplied by the Treasury, as, except in the case of the Railway Station inspections, no means are provided by which this Department can report directly cases of default. If such means were provided there would probably arise considerable advantages, to which attention was invited in paragraph 68 of last year's Report.
- 66. Subject to the foregoing observations and explanations, and to the adjustment of outstanding advances in full accordance with the services and votes to which such advances have been charged in the accompanying Statements, subject also to the disallowances specified in *Appendix* P, as well as to satisfactory replies being furnished to all outstanding queries, I consider that the Statements now submitted are correct Abstracts of the Treasurer's Receipts and Disbursements within the year 1892.
- 67. The Statements marked F, G, and H, together with the detailed Statement of the Public Debt, being, however, outside of the requirements of the 22nd Clause of the Audit Act, do not come under the examination and report required by the 36th Clause, and their contents rest therefore on the responsibility of the Treasurer.

I have the honor to submit for the consideration of the Colonial Treasurer that the entry at page 28 of his Accounts for 1892, "Refunds to Lessees under Crown Rents Act of 1890," £128,258 12s. 3d. requires amendment.

1st. That the refunds amount only to £108,208 6s., and that the remainder, £20,050 6s. 3d., consist of payments of interest at 5 per cent. The entry should accordingly be divided into the above sums.\*

2nd. That the sixth clause of the Act, 54 Victoria No. 11, being the authority for the refunds and interest in question, the Vote of £18,000 taken on the Supplementary Estimates in the Appropriation Act, 55 Victoria No. 36, is surplusage and should be written off.

3rd. That as the Act, 54 Victoria No. 11, clause 6, quotes no year against which such refunds and interest are to be charged—those payments as in similar unfixed statutory authorities for payments should appear as for the year in which they are paid. The entry should therefore be classed as for services of 1892.

4th. That so far as the refunds are concerned, it has always been the practice to charge refunds to Current Account, with the exception of the Special Vote taken in 1889 of £165,000 for Refunds to Pastoral Lessees. In the case in question there is no Special Vote and the refunds should appear in the usual course, but under quotation of Act 54 Victoria No. 11.

The Vote of £18,000 for interest is, as already stated in my previous letter, surplusage, and the Colonial Treasurer treats it so by not making use of it, and classifying it as among the Services voted under the Appropriation Act of 1892 as for 1891, but shows it so far correctly as expended under the Act 54 Vic. I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 20th ultimo, in which you inform me that the Treasurer regrets that he cannot see his way to carry to the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, the accrued interest included in the amount credited as the proceeds of the recent loan of £4,500,000, and to state in reply that on further inquiry I find that the Revenue Account has a claim for a much larger sum than that mentioned in my letter of 12th July last, which has been, in my opinion, erroneously carried to the credit of the General Loan Account in the proceeds of the loans negotiated under the Loan Acts 41 Victoria No. 7 to 52 Victoria No. 16.

On careful computation of the terms on which the loans referred to have been negotiated, and according to which the proceeds have been credited, it is found that the following amounts represent the interest which accrued either previous to the date of the tenders being sent in or between the dates from which the stock sold was to bear interest, and the several dates at which the instalments making up the full amount of the loan were paid in, in terms of the notices calling for tenders—that is to say:—

The Revenue Account having been charged and standing now charged with the interest actually paid as above stated, while the General Loan Account has had the benefit of it, there appears to be no doubt that an adjustment to that extent is due between the two accounts over and above the £28,522 12s. on the recent loan under 54 Vic. No. 33 referred to in my former letter.

I desire to add that in the colony of Victoria the accrued interest, which, as in the loans raised by this Colony, forms part of the price tendered for its loans in London, is carried to the credit of the account to which the interest payable on the loans is debited, that is, to the Consolidated Revenue Fund of that colony, and not to the Loan Fund.

I trust, therefore, that the Treasurer will take an early opportunity of adjusting the erroneous credits specified above, further details of which can be given if desired.

Memorandum.

The Treasury (Account Branch), Sydney, 18 August, 1892. THE position the Auditor-General now, after a tacit approval of our procedure for the past ten years,

assumes is demonstrated to be untenable by the usual operations of floating a loan. For instance, it is decided in Council to issue a certain amount of Debentures (or of late to inscribe a certain amount of stock) with a prescribed currency, and with interest at a fixed rate per cent. to be payable thereon, to commence from a certain date.

The loan is authorised by an Act which provides that the principal sum shall be secured upon the

Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony and bear interest at a certain rate per cent.

It is therefore the duty of the Government to appropriate specially for the interest, and so the Consolidated Revenue Fund annually bears a special appropriation for interest on Debentures and Funded Stock,—that is to say, before a loan is floated the currency is settled, and the interest provided for from Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Such preliminaries cannot be affected by subsequent terms of sale.

It has been our practice I find as far back as 1874,—I cannot see why the Auditor-General does not go further back than 1881,—in order to effect a favourable sale of our stock, to allow the subscribers to pay by instalments generally, thus, 5 per cent. on application, 10 to 20 per cent. on allotment, balance 20 to 25 per cent. by monthly instalments.

The terms allowed correspondingly affect the price obtained for the Stock, and if the Auditor-General's contention were upheld, the advantage gained would go to the credit of the Consolidated

Revenue Fund instead of legitimately enhancing the credit of the country.

The Auditor-General's reference to the practice of the colony of Victoria does not add any weight

to his opinion.

The Commissioners of Audit of Victoria might with equal force point out to the Government of Victoria, that the Colony of New South Wales charged the interest on a loan from the date of currency to the Consolidated Revenue Fund, irrespective of the date and terms of the sale.

I cannot alter my opinion in the matter. I would direct attention to section 2 of Act 52 Victoria No. 16, which enacts "All sums borrowed under this Act shall be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, and shall be by him placed to a separate credit, to be called 'The General Loan Account.'" I presume the words "all sums borrowed" embrace the amount over-raised. Further, the sums short-raised under certain Acts exceed the amounts over-raised under others, and the General Loan Account is, therefore, short of the necessary funds to meet the liabilities now included in our Public Debt. I would also point out that the £1,390,600 issued under Act 52 Vic. No. 16 was a part of the £3,500,000 loan floated in July, 1889, under Acts 48 Vic. No. 26 and 52 Vic. No. 16, at a premium of £26,210, and there is no reason why the £10,413 shown as a premium under 52 Vic. No. 16 should not have been shown in reduction of £377,982, the amount already represented to be short-raised under 48 Victoria No. 26.— J.J.H., 16/1/92

Case for the opinion of the Attorney General.

Subject:—Disposal of premium upon negotiation of a Loan secured on the Consolidated Revenue Fund. UNDER the Loan Act 52 Victoria No. 16 authority is given for raising a sum not exceeding £1,390,600 for paying off certain debentures maturing in 1888 and 1889, the amount to be placed to the credit of the "General Loan Account."

A loan in the form of Inscribed Stock was raised in 1889 under that authority and realised a net

sum of £1,401,013 15s. 5d. or at a total premium of £10,413 15s. 5d.

The Auditor-General claims that the premium being an excess over the amount authorised to be raised should go to the account of the Consolidated Revenue Fund which is liable for the repayment of the loan at maturity and in accordance with precedents. Further that it is incorrect to place the excess arising from the premium received on the negotiation of the loan to the credit of the General Loan Account inasmuch as there is no authorised service to which it can be applied.

The Treasury plead the provision of the 3rd section of the "Loans Funds Amalgamation Act of 1879" as justifying their action in including this premium as part of Loan Moneys applicable to authorised Loan Services.

The Auditor-General replies that the section quoted of the Act 42 Victoria No. 16 cannot apply to moneys received by way of premium or otherwise in excess of the sums authorised by the several Loan

Acts, as those Loan Acts distinctly limit the sums to be raised not only in gross but in detail.

Further, that the cost of raising loans or the profit arising therefrom, is a matter totally distinct from the operations of the General Loan Account, which legitimately embraces only the receipt and expenditure of sums specifically authorised to be raised by loans for and duly appropriated to certain Services.

Also that the sole purpose of the Loans Fund Amalgamation Act was to unite in one account the Loan Services which had previously been directed to be kept in separate accounts, and to make the balances at the credit of those several accounts available as one fund for any duly appropriated Loan Service, but so as that no individual appropriation should in any case be exceeded.

The Colonial Treasurer replies that he is unable to share the Auditor-General's view of the

The Auditor-General respectfully solicits the opinion of the Attorney-General as to whether the sum of £10,413 15s. 5d. received in excess of the sum of £1,390,600 by way of premium on negotiation of a loan for that amount under the Act 52 Victoria No. 16 can legitimately be carried to the credit of, and used as a part of, the General Loan Account—or, whether said premium should not be held to be a profit accruing to the Consolidated Revenue Fund, on the security of which the loan was raised.

Under Sec.,—Is it your desire that the "Treasury view of the matter" should be communicated to the Attorney-General, in addition to the reply to his query?—M.R., 9/9/92. I do not see that it will affect the advising of the Honorable the Attorney-General; but I imagine the reference to this Department was a strong hint to us that, in returning the paper, we might state our views. It can do no harm to inform the Secretary as to the views held by this Department.—F.K., 9/9/92. Mr. Ross. Informed accordingly.—M.R., 9/9/92.

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 7th instant, and to inform you in reply that the Colonial Treasurer has no objection whatever to the Attorney-General's complying with the Auditor-General's request for an advising as to the mode of dealing with a premium obtained on the negotiation of a loan under the Act 52 Victoria No. 16.

The Treasury view of the matter is that the premium should be credited to Revenue, provided the

Revenue made good the sums short-raised owing to the securities having been sold under par.

As the matter stands at present, the amount over-raised in consequence of a premium having been obtained will be deducted from the amounts short-raised owing to the securities having been sold at less I have, &c., than par, and stock issued for the balance.

Copy opinion of the Honorable the Attorney-General. I AM asked by the Auditor-General to advise what is the proper course to pursue with regard to the disposal of any profit which may accrue on the raising of loans, with especial reference to a sum of £10,413 15s. 5d. over-raised by way of premium on the loan of £1,390,600, authorised by the "Repayment of Loans Act, 1888" (a).

That Act authorised the raising of sums of money "not exceeding" £1,390,600 by means of (a) 52 Vic. No. the sale of debentures, and the repayment of the loan is secured on the Consolidated Revenue Fund. The London market was favourable at the time the loan was offered, and a net premium of £10,413 15s. 5d.

accrued on the transaction over and above the sum authorised to be raised by the first section of the Act.

By section 4 (b) of the "Loan Fund Amalgamation Act of 1879" all sums of money thereafter "to be borrowed under any special Act" are to be carried to and form a "General Loan Account," and by 16. section 3 (c) all sums of money thereafter "to be borrowed under the authority of any special Act" may (c) Ib. be applied to any Loan Service authorised in the Acts to raise the loans. There is a proviso that no

larger sum may be appropriated to any Loan Service than is authorised by the special Act.

If this sum of money is paid into the General Loan Account I do not see that there is any lawful way of paying it out. The General Loan Account can only be used for loan services, and if this money is paid out on any loan services there may probably be a contravention of the proviso in section 3; but apart from this I do not see how the premium can be said to be money "borrowed under the authority" of the Act of 1888 (d), which does not (see section 1) authorise the raising of any sum exceeding the (d) 52 Vic. No. £1,390,600; and if it is not borrowed under the authority of the Act there can be no authority for paying it into the General Loan Account.

I am, therefore, of opinion, that this money ought not to be paid into the General Loan Account, and that it is not included in any money or fund which is authorised to be paid out or applied to any loan service. The money, therefore, ought, I think, to be paid to the credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, the security on which the £1,390,600 was raised.

I do not see that there is anything in the law to authorise the Treasury to set this sum against any

sum or sums short-raised.

I should mention that I hesitated to advise on this matter unless with the knowledge and concurrence of the Colonial Treasurer, and therefore ascertained the view of my colleague as to my giving an opinion. He, however, has no objection whatever to that course. (See letter, Under Secretary for Finance and Trade to Secretary to the Attorney-General, 9th September, 1892.)

In reference to your letter of 20th January last, in reply to mine of the 6th idem, I have the honor to state that I considered it desirable to refer the question in dispute to the Attorney-General, and having obtained his opinion thereupon, I enclose for the information of the Colonial Treasurer a copy thereof, from which it will be seen that the Attorney-General confirms my view of the matter, that the money in question should be credited to the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and further, that it cannot be dealt with as a set-off against any sum or sums short-raised.

As, however, it is shown in my letter of 12th August last that the proceeds of the loan of £1,390,600 under 52 Victoria No. 16 included accrued interest to the amount of £16,288 2s. 3d., the sum in question, £10,413 15s. 5d., with the difference of £5,874 6s. 10d., will now have to be credited to the Consolidated Revenue Fund as accrued interest instead of as a premium on the negotiation of the loan.

#### MEMORANDUM.

James J. Hinchy, Accountant, to The Under Secretary for Finance and Trade.

The Treasury, Account Branch, Sydney, 8 October, 1892.

The principle of carrying to the Consolidated Revenue Fund the premium gained on the issue of a loan, has already been acknowledged by the Treasury in its treatment of the surpluses of £444 19s. 6d. and £15,833 10s. 9d. on the respective loans issued under Acts 35 Victoria No. 5 and 36 Victoria No. 2,

which were duly credited to revenue.

The alleged premium under Act 52 Victoria No. 16 of £10,413 15s. 5d. has not been similarly treated, for reasons herein set forth, and if the following facts were brought under the notice of the Honorable the Attorney-General he might be disposed to reconsider his opinion of 14th September, 1892, because they may considerably alter the data upon which that opinion is based, so far as the Act 52 Victoria No. 16 is concerned.

The Loan Act, 48 Victoria No. 26, authorized the raising of a sum of £14,388,303 for various Public Works and Services, and on 31st December, 1888, stock had been inscribed under this Act to the extent of £10,213,300, realising a sum of £9,819,520 19s. 3d., and leaving £4,568,782 0s. 9d. still to be raised to carry out the purposes of the Act.

raised to carry out the purposes of the Act.

Under the Act 52 Victoria No. 16 it was necessary to raise a sum of £1,390,600 to meet 5 per

cent. Debentures maturing in 1888 and 1889.

Accordingly, a loan of £3,500,000 was floated in July, 1889, and the stock inscribed under the Acts 48 Victoria No. 26 and 52 Victoria No. 16, conjointly. The loan realised £3,526,210 8s. 2d. (having been floated at a premium of £26,210 8s. 2d.), which was credited to General Loan Account, as proceeds under the joint Acts.

In recording this loan in the Public Debt Statement, the proceeds and premium were thus

The previous loss on the issues under Act 48 Victoria No. 26 of £393,779 Os. 9d. was thus reduced by the apportioned amount over-raised of £15,796 12s. 9d., and the amount to be raised under that Act. was lessened by the proceeds as above apportioned, leaving still an apparent loss of £377,982 8s.

The premium of £10,413 15s. 5d. allotted to the Act 52 Victoria No. 16 was shown in the column

of amounts over-raised.

Victoria No. 16.

This apportionment was made purely for the simplification of the record in the Public Debt Statement. Two of its columns are intended to show the amounts over-raised, and not yet raised, under each Loan Act. Where a loan has been issued under a single Act this has invariably been done, and the amounts over-raised (to wit, 35 Victoria No. 5 and 36 Victoria No. 2) credited to revenue, but loans have in some cases of late years been floated under several Acts combined, and the Acts are usually bracketed, so that the necessity of an arbitrary, and incorrect division of proceeds is avoided.

In this case it could not be done, as the records of previous issues under 48 Victoria No. 26 would have been disturbed to confusion by the addition of the figures relating to the issue conjointly with 52

It may be pointed out that the Loan Act, 41 Victoria No. 7, which authorised only £1,120,000 was used conjointly with other Acts to raise three loans, viz., £2,050,000 in 1881, £2,000,000 in 1882, and £3,000,000 in July, 1883, yet the Auditor-General contended that the whole of the loan authorised under

that Act was effected under the first issue of £2,050,000.

If so, how could it have been used as an authority for inscription of further loans; and a premium having been gained on the first and second issues, attended with a loss on the third, what amount could be considered over-raised under 41 Victoria No. 7? It was bracketed with 43 Victoria No. 11, and a sum of £47,988 4s. 4d. appears in the "over-raised column" of the Public Debt Statement as against the two Acts.

The Auditor-General does not ask for a transfer of this sum to revenue, although it is in the same category as the £10,413 15s. 5d., and may be affected by the amounts short-raised under later Acts.

combined with 43 Vic. No. 11.

Returning to the Act 52 Victoria No. 16, which authorised the raising of £1,390,600, the Public Debt Statement could be made to show that the proportion allotted to that Act in the loan of £3,500,000 was £1,380,264, which exactly produced, as proceeds, the sum of £1,390,600 required, and the balance could be added to the figures relating to the Act 48 Victoria No. 26. Then the imaginary surplus of £10,413 15s. 5d. would disappear by a process as defensible and rational as that which has apparently created it.

But in whatever manner a loan may be shown in the Public Debt Statement, I do not think the

question of crediting the proceeds should be thereby affected.

The loan of £3,500,000, issued under the Acts 48 Victoria No. 26 and 52 Victoria No. 16, resulted in a premium of £26,210 8s. 2d. (there is actually no such premium as £10,413 15s. 5d.), and as each Act has a claim, if necessary, to the surplus proceeds, the amount authorised under 52 Victoria No. 16 having been obtained, the balance of the proceeds may, I think, be credited under the Act 48 Victoria No. 26, reducing the amount still to be raised to that extent.

The £10,413 15s. 5d., therefore, which appears in the Public Debt Statement as over-raised on account of Act 52 Victoria No. 16, has actually been credited to General Loan Account in reduction of

the amount to be raised under Act 48 Victoria, No. 26.

The figures of the Public Debt Statement may be adjusted when future issues are recorded.

The Auditor-General asks for a sum of £16,288 2s. 3d. to be credited to the Consolidated Revenue, being the interest which accrued from the date of the flotation of the loan under Act 52 Victoria No. 16 to the date of receipt of the proceeds by the Government. This amount is also arrived at by proportionately dividing the loan, and is as imaginary as the alleged premium of £10,413 15s. 5d.

However, the Honorable the Treasurer had already decided not to deduct accrued interest from proceeds of loans, and as the question is not touched upon in the Attorney-General's opinion, I do

not see the necessity of its revival.

Copy further opinion of the Honorable the Attorney General.

There would be no difference of opinion on this matter if it were quite realised that a premium received on the successful flotation of a loan, is not only not money borrowed under the authority of an Act which authorises the raising of a sum "not exceeding" a sum named, but is in fact not money borrowed at all. That the second of these propositions is true (the first, I think, will appear from my opinion of 9th September) is made clear when we consider that there is no contract, express or implied, to repay any such premium. The loan in question, as described in Mr. Hinchy's memorandum of 8th October 1892, noticed a premium of just under 152, nor cent. If that premium is not meaner which the October, 1892, netted a premium of just under 15s. per cent. If that premium is not money which the Crown is called on to repay to the lenders it is not a loan. For each £100 15s. (say) the total sum to be paid on maturity of the loan will be £100. The odd money is mere profit, not borrowed, and therefore not loan money; and there is no account to which there is authority to credit such chance receipts other than the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

I do not think the case is altered by the memo. of October 8th. It appears that when this loan was raised in July, 1889, not only was the full amount authorised by 52 Victoria No. 16, viz., £1,390,600, placed on the market and sold, but also other stock amounting to £2,190.000, being portion of a loan authorised by 48 Victoria No. 26. (Before this some £10,213,000 stock had been floated under the latter Act, which had authorised the borrowing of £14,388,303). On loans raised under 48 Victoria, before July, 1889, there had been a loss, through selling below par, of some £393,779. But on the joint floating of the two sums in July, 1889, a profit of £26,210 8s. 2d. was made by way of premium, and the stock raised was inscribed under both 48 Victoria No. 26 and 52 Victoria No. 16. The Treasury

divided this profit proportionately—the floating being all one transaction—between the loans under the two Acts, thus showing in the Public Debt Statement a profit of £10,413 15s. 5d. obtained in respect of the stock inscribed under 52 Victoria. Having done this, how can the Treasury now contend that the whole profit of £26,210 8s 2d. attending the combined transaction ought to be placed against the loss incurred by the sales at discount of prior loans under the 48 Victoria? If this course was allowable at the outset—and I do not think it was—it cannot be taken now. The money has been divided in account, and I am far from thinking the £10,413 odd an "imaginary" profit, as described. This lastnamed amount should, I have no doubt, go to the Consolidated Revenue as previously advised. EDMUND BARTON,

### APPENDIX J.

CORRESPONDENCE with the Treasury as to mode of dealing with the proceeds of Treasury Bills. The Auditor-General to The Under Secretary for Finance and Trade.

Sir, Department of Audit, 10 March, 1893. In acknowledging receipt of your letter of yesterday's date, conveying particulars of sale of Treasury Bills under the Act 55 Vic. No. 7, and stating that the proceeds have been credited to the "General Loan Account," I have the honor to point out that clause 10 of the Act referred to directs that the moneys raised are to be carried to a "General Loan Fund Account," and not, as in the Loan Acts, to the "General Loan Account," for application to the specific services set forth in those Acts.

Taken in connection with clauses 4 and 5 of the Act in question, and with the understood object in view of creating a Temporary Loan Fund for general loan purposes, pending the raising of loans proper, it seems to me that the money raised by these Treasury Bills ought to be placed to a separate account, as designated, until the loans are raised on account of which the proceeds of these bills are required for meeting current deficiencies in the funds for authorised Loan Services. Such deficiencies should be debited from time to time to the "General Loan Fund Account," as advances on account of specific Loan Acts, requiring them to be supplied with funds in the same way as advances were made some years ago from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to accounts of specific Loan Acts.

If this course be not taken, or unless the proceeds of these bills be at once allotted to specific Loan Acts (which would not be advisable), it will be impossible to keep clear the accounts of the several

loans, and their application under the Loan Acts.

May I request that you will call the attention of the Colonial Treasurer to this matter as early as possible. I have, &c.,

I have therefore now to request that I may be informed on account of what specific Loan Acts the Treasury Bills referred to have been negotiated, and to what amount for each Act.

The same information is also essential in regard to the proceeds of the Funded Stock under the Act 56 Victoria No. 1. If, as is possible, the amount intended to be borrowed under the Acts 55 Victoria No. 7 and 56 Victoria No. 1 was to provide funds in anticipation of further Loan Acts, it will then be necessary to state what proportion of the proceeds of the securities in question are to be set aside for

### APPENDIX K.

HISTORICAL Statement of the negotiation of Loans raised from the year 1842 to the year 1892 inclusive.

### Preliminary Memorandum.

Prior to the consolidation of the revenues of the Colony in 1855 under the present Constitution Act, the revenue derived from the sales of the waste lands of the Crown, after defraying the expenses of survey and management, was devoted under the instructions of the Imperial Government especially to the encouragement of immigration, for the purpose of providing farm labourers and others to assist the purchasers as well as the tenants of Crown lands in the cultivation and management thereof.

The demand for extra population in the Colony, and the desire among the labouring classes of the home country to emigrate, rendered it desirable to augment, or rather anticipate, the funds available for the purpose. Hence, commencing in the year 1842, moneys were raised on very short-dated debentures, described as Land and Immigration Debentures secured on the revenue derivable from the Crown lands, described later on as the Territorial Revenue, for the purpose of immigration only. The loans so raised up to the year 1850 inclusive, amounted to £282,200, and were all redeemed at due dates by the produce of the revenue on which they were secured, closing with the year 1855.

From 1851 to 1855 further loans were raised in the same manner and for the same purpose, with a currency in each case of five years. The total amount so raised was £423,000, of which only £57,500 fell due and were paid off out of the Territorial Revenue prior to the balance of that revenue being transferred to the Consolidated Revenue Fund in 1856, leaving a liability on the latter fund, or, more properly, a preferent claim on the growing produce of the Land Revenue, to meet the overdrawn expenses for immigration, which had been expressly secured to the debenture-holders to the amount of £365,500. Of that sum, only £50,800 were paid off in 1856, 1857, and 1859, out of revenue, the remainder forming the basis of new loans raised in aid of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to meet its engagements.

The above debentures were issued at various rates of interest from 51 d. to 23 d. per diem, and except in three instances, at par and above par. The total produce of the debentures issued from 1842 to 1855 for the principal sum in all of £705,200 realised £724,733 3s. 1d., the whole of which, not being subject to deductions for expenses of negotiation or for accrued interest, was applied to immigration purposes, creating thus an overdraft for these purposes of £365,500, to be provided for as above stated by

the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

A further and peculiar loan was also raised on the security of the Territorial Revenue under the authority of the Act 16 Vic. No. 39, for the purpose of providing funds for the issue of loans to the Sydney Railway Company. As explained elsewhere these loans were not repaid by the company nor was the amount accounted for in the purchase of their property by the Government. The debentures issued for £217,500 in all were thus left as a further legacy of liability to be adjusted by the Consolidated Revenue Fund. Of those debentures £200,000 realised a premium of £7,365 3s. 4d., which sum was paid over to the Sydney Railway Company.

The General Revenue, as it was then designated, was also made liable for debentures issued on its security for "Public Works" to the amount of £360,300 in the years 1854 and 1855 prior to the 23rd November, 1855, which at that date became also a legacy payable by the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

At the 23rd November, 1855, the date of the proclamation of the New Constitution, the Public Debt for which the Consolidated Revenue Fund was liable consisted of—
