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1. Introduction

Roads and Maritime Services NSW (Roads and Maritime) have completed safety improvement works along Bells Line of Road between Mount Tomah and Kurrajong Heights, comprising overtaking lanes and safety works at a total of eight sites.

The various safety improvement projects were approved under Part 5.1 of the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 and the Commonwealth Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (2014/7346). The project was approved on 3 November 2015.

This compliance report covers the reporting period between 3 November 2017 and 3 November 2018;
